## Executive Order No. 2020-11

**WHEREAS**, on March 17, 2020, the undersigned issued Executive Order No. 2020-10, directing additional emergency measures in response to the threat posed by COVID-19, to include temporarily prohibiting restaurants from providing certain food services for on-premises consumption and prohibiting events at government facilities that would convene fifty(50) or more persons in a single room, area or other confined indoor or outdoor space; and

**WHEREAS**, COVID-19 represents an evolving public health threat, which requires that the State of South Carolina continue to take all necessary and appropriate actions in proactively preparing for and promptly responding to the current public health emergency and the significant economic impacts associated with the same.

The aforementioned will result in the New Ellenton Police Department enforcing the Governor's Executive Order in the following way: No restaurant shall provide on-premises consumption of food or beverage. Only pick-up, drive thru or delivery services may be available at any restaurant or facility that serves food or beverages in The City of New Ellenton. There will be no curfew enacted at this time; this mandate is subject to change at any time.

It is, always, the focus of New Ellenton Police Department to be proactive in order to keep the public safe and allow business to continue as much as possible while working in accordance with the South Carolina Code of Laws.

### **SBA Approves Gov. Henry McMaster's Request for Disaster Assistance**

**COLUMBIA, S.C.** – The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) has approved Governor Henry McMaster's request for the agency to offer South Carolina's small businesses with disaster assistance. Governor McMaster requested the disaster declaration in a March 17 letter to SBA Administrator Jovita Carranza.

The disaster declaration means that South Carolina's small businesses that have suffered substantial economic injury as a result of the COVID-19 virus may qualify for low-interest federal disaster loans. All 46 counties are included in the disaster declaration.

"These low-interest loans are of monumental importance to our business community," said Gov. Henry McMaster. "There's no doubt that our state's small businesses have suffered losses throughout this incredibly difficult time, but help is on the way. To have Administrator Carranza approve our

request so quickly shows that President Trump's administration is fully committed to helping our businesses recover from the impact of this virus."
